

Erasmus+ student charter

Context

City / Country : France Structure : Erasmus+

Area of activity: Education, educational mobility

Identified needs

Erasmus+ has produced an Erasmus+ student charter to make the concept of a student mobility clearer. Les Apprimeurs wanted to present the information in a more accessible form.

Objectives

This 4-page leaflet clearly lists each student's rights and obligations **before**, **during and after the mobility**. It helps students prepare for the exchange experience. The leaflet is freely accessible on the website of Erasmus, as well as here (only in text form, without the formatting).

Target group

Higher education students



Existing

A printable charter is available on Erasmus plus website. It is a 4-page brochure presenting the necessary information in 2 columns. There are 4 main parts in the document, 1 – before the mobility, 2 – during the mobility, 3 – after the mobility, 4 – throughout the mobility. Each part is divided in 2 subparts – 1 – your rights, 2 – your obligations. While the document is rather concise, the presentation of the information divided in 2 columns makes the message unclear and hard to follow. The message itself is presented with an administrative jargon that can also be problematic for the students.





Proposal

Two simplified versions have been prepared:

The first one, following the format of the original. A revised version presents information without the column division. Complicated vocabulary has been simplified, all while keeping the necessary information. We kept the division in chapters and subchapters, but presented the necessary information by using bullet points. This new form of the presentation also let us shorten the document considerably, making the new document 3 pages long instead of 4. The initially used font was IBM Plex Sans, and in the adaptation process it has been changed to Arial, which is the font used by Erasmus+.



The second version presents the document as a tri-fold leaflet. The structure of 4 parts, each one with 2 subparts, was maintained. The font used is Arial. In a manner similar to the first adaptation, the text was shortened, the important information was presented with the help of bullet points, and the specific terms were replaced by words easier to understand. The colours used in the original documents were maintained.

Length and conciseness

Yes, the material is concise while retaining essential content. Excessive

- Has excessive density or information overload been avoided?

density and information overload have been avoided by simplifying the text and using bullet points. (SABA) In general, yes, but the brochure remains a bit text-heavy. Maybe dividing the text into more pages would make it clearer and less dense? (Logopsycom)

The adapted version is shorter, reducing the document from four pages to three, making it more concise while retaining essential information. Bullet points replace long sentences, making it easier to scan and process information quickly. (Studium)

Language complexity and clarity

- Is the language clear, accessible, and free from unnecessary technical terms, jargon, or overly complex structures (e.g., passive voice, long sentences)?
- Does the text align with relevant linguistic criteria (e.g., CEFR levels A1, A2, etc.)?

Yes, the language is clear, accessible, and free from unnecessary jargon or complex structures. It aligns with relevant linguistic criteria, likely around CEFR level B1-B2, making it easy for students to understand. (SABA)
